SR 42 and North Street Project Update

- Jeremy, the project manager, is waiting for AES to install covers over the power lines near the storage units at the northeast corner.
- Poles are on order to arrive within 26-28 weeks from when the last footer is poured.

September 30th Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Meeting

- Village staff met with Environmental Specialist II, Monica Janes
- The meeting was scheduled to review our contingency plan, asset management plan, sample site plan, water system mapping, service line inventory, flushing program and backflow prevention program.
- Sites visited and assed were the Lytle Tower, Ferry Tower, Covey Booster Station, disinfection by product locations, Bulk Water Station, EP001 Spigot, Water Treatment Facility and all well locations.

There is a village ordinance for council to adopt the Warren County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation 5-year plan.

The new plan must be adopted by November 5th, 2025.

A new, no parking zone has been designated on Franklin Road and Third Street at the S-Curve in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code (ORC).

The Village Maintenance Department painted the curb yellow to indicate the new restrictions.

The Village Water Maintenance Department repaired a service line connected to the main water line at 5099 Lytle Road.

Village Administration and the Merchants Association on Main Street Committee (MOMS) have been working on several projects to revitalize Main Street and the Business District.

A new fenced area has been installed at the Main Street Maintenance Facility to deter thefts.

Cargill has delivered 100 tons of road salt to the Village salt bin storage facility. This will increase our total tonnage to between 250 and 300 tons of road salt for the upcoming winter season.
